2 % of scientists admitted to have fabricated, falsified or modified data or results at least once


Up to 34 % admit other questionable research practices (QRP)

14 % of scientists observed fabrication, falsification or modification done by colleagues Up to 72 % observed others doing questionable research practices (QRP)

21 studies included; "tip of the iceberg"

RI is not only the responsibility of individual researchers



Administrative Office **OeAWI**

Administrative office:

- First point of contact in cases of alleged research misconduct
- Communication with all persons involved
- Support and advising of the Commission (e.g. international context)



OeAWI

Commission

- Responsible for investigating cases of (alleged) research misconduct thoroughly and objectively.
- It constitutes an independent body and consists of renowned researchers, mainly from abroad
- It is responsible for cases in Austria, related to Austria or involving Austrian researchers
- Representing different fields: humanities, law, social sciences, life sciences, natural and technical sciences, economic sciences and medical sciences

The European Code of Conduct for Research Integrity REVISED EDITION



Good research practices are based on fundamental principles of research integrity. They guide researchers in their work as well as in their engagement with the practical, ethical and intellectual challenges inherent in research.

These principles are:

- **Reliability** in ensuring the quality of research, reflected in the design, the methodology, the analysis and the use of resources.
- *Honesty* in developing, undertaking, reviewing, reporting and communicating research in a transparent, fair, full and unbiased way.
- **Respect** for colleagues, research participants, society, ecosystems, cultural heritage and the environment.
- **Accountability** for the research from idea to publication, for its management and organisation, for training, supervision and mentoring, and for its wider impacts.

OeAWI guidelines for GSP



Research misconduct refers to

- wilful
- conscious or
- grossly negligent

violations of the Standards of GSP (§ 2).



OeAWI guidelines for GSP





- Fabrication of data
- Falsification of data
- Plagiarism

OeAWI guidelines for GSP



- Unjustified refusal to provide access to primary and original data
- Obstructing the research activities of other scientists/researchers
- Sabotaging research activities
- Providing inaccurate information in a grant proposal which may place competing scientists/researchers at a disadvantage
- Creating disadvantages to the career advancement of whistle-blowers



OeAWI guidelines for GSP



Research misconduct can also include involvement in other persons' violations, e.g.:

- Active involvement in the misconduct of others
- Co-authorship of publications based on falsified data or otherwise generated through violations of the GSP-standards
- Neglect of supervisory obligations

- Statements within the scientific discourse
- Errors made in good faith
- Mobbing

- The plan should be comprehensive and tangible to address various dimensions of RI






<text></text>	 The RIPP should outline the steps that the RPO or RFO will take to promote research integrity in the context of its mission and disciplinary focus It should address a number of RI topics – and outline policies for how these topics will be handled.








Declaration included in part A of each submitted EU research proposal

6) We declare that the proposal complies with ethical principles (including the highest standards of research integrity as set out in the <u>ALLEA European Code of Conduct for Research Integrity</u>, as well as applicable international and national law, including the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union and the European Convention on Human Rights and its Supplementary Protocols. <u>Appropriate procedures</u>, <u>policies and structures</u> are in place to foster responsible research practices, to prevent questionable research practices and research misconduct, and to handle allegations of breaches of the principles and standards in the Code of Conduct.


